Meeting was called to order @ 5:16 p.m. in the Commission Chambers on the 2nd floor of the Governmental Center.

Approval of Minutes MOTION by Mistele, seconded by Stepka to approved the minutes of March 11, 2019 as presented. APPROVED unanimously.

First Public Comment None.

Discussion took place regarding the availability of a criminal history to the defense attorney who is representing a client in court. Stepka agreed with Mistele that it would be helpful but the Judges do not have that information either.

Shively indicated that they prepare this information for felons and have a full time person doing that alone.

Further discussion continued regarding LEIN information and iChat.

Mistele wants to make sure the defense attorneys have the same information the court has for the person they are representing.

Options were discussed and will be explored further including County access for PAO, defense attorneys and Courts.

Chris Forsyth indicated that a MIDC summit was held on Tuesday, April 30th and had a good turnout with most of the stakeholders being in attendance.

One of the issues discussed was the scheduling of arraignments and coordination between the courts. Since they occur at different times, we have agreed to increase the payment to defense attorneys to \$600/per day to match the amount paid in Leelanau County and cover coming back in the afternoon to handle circuit court matters as well.

The Compliance Plan is up for renewal, has been submitted and accepted but we have not received notice of approval yet.

Confidentiality at the Jail and MIDC standards for indigency vs. partial indigency were also discussed.

Joanie Blamer, NLCMH, asked what information the group was seeking regarding "protocols" in the jail. The response was after approximately 6 months, what changes have taken place and how it's working.

In response to one of the Public Comments, the charge of this committee is not to build a jail but to look at the criminal justice system and provide information that may be helpful.

Anna Dituri - appreciates this committee and sees value in having discussion and brainstorming.
